**Add-ons:** Not necessary but handy

Most of my paints are M. Graham A couple are Daniel Smith or Holbien

If in doubt, a warm and cool hue of red, yellow and blue, plus paynes grey or a dark neutral tint

Paper: (This is what I'm going to use) 9x12 140# cold press watercolor pad

100% cotton

Palette: Whatever you have

#### Watercolor Brushes:

(Synthetics are fine) 1/2" - 1.5" Flats

Small, medium and large rounds

Medium Dagger brush

# For this workshop you'll only need white gouache plus you regular paints:

Winsor & Newton Designer's Gouache, 37 ml (1.25oz) tube, Permanent White **OR...** (**Big tube**)

Dr. Ph. Martin's Bleedproof White

If you already have gouache paint use that plus white. If you have transparent watercolors adding white gouache will make them opaque.

• If you want to buy a starter set of good gouache I recommend Holbein 5 primary colors set gouache.

Drawing is a given. Design is everything. Failure is just feedback.

This materials list is a guide only. If you have materials that are close to the suggested ones please bring them and we can decide if you need to add anything. However, the paper is important and I recommend it be used for desired results. Fabriano, Arches, Strathmore (brown cover etc. are OK too...
